Letter from our Founder

Youth Inmates Program

In a democratic society, the justice system must operate in such a way that citizens are treated equally. Equality and impartiality are the two pre-requisites for a just society. As Reinhold Niebuhr pointed out: "Man's capacity for justice makes democracy possible, but man's inclination to injustice makes democracy necessary". This necessity of democracy requires the respect of human rights and an unmatched attachment for the rule of law. Unfortunately, many young people in Haiti are caught in prisons without the ability to be heard by a judge even after three to ten years behind bars. This situation undermines the basic principles of the national constitution which requires a maximum 48 hours for trial after being held. That's why our team supports young people in Haitian prisons to get their case heard and their sentence known while providing them with hygienic items needed to endure difficulty of the prison.

Impact:

20 cases appeared into court in Cap-Haitian

200 young people and women received hygienic kits from our staff.



Immigration Program

Migration is one of the major problems faced by Haitian today. It is a problem because it entails two metrics. The first one is Haiti which is the country of origine. This country's capital becomes a crime-ridden area where gang violence kills people and ablaze their property. On top of that, the politics of corruption deprived communities of basic incentives they need to thrive. As a result, people migrate either internally or internationally. Internally, they left the capital to relocate in another part of the country as it is recurrent when they left Port-au-Prince to relocate in Cap-Haitian or Northeast department. Internationally, they leave the country through boats usually called boat people or charter flights or crossing the Dominican Republic Border to go elsewhere looking for a better.



However, no matter how great the effort from the Haitian migrant is to leave his country, the host country's decision could either make his life better or miserable. From Haiti to Chile, to Brazil, to Mexico, to the United State or Dominican Republic, Haitian migrants must grapple with racial discrimination and other inhumane treatments. One of the countries that create a politics of anti-Haitian immigrants is the Dominican Republic since late 2024 where they constantly violate their rights, especially women and girls without any accountability. Women might be pregnant or breastfeeding, the politics of 10 000 Haitian Immigrants a week by the current President Luis Abinader makes of exception. That's why our team went to Ouanaminthe which share the Dominican Republic and Haiti border in Northeast to support Haitian repatriates.

Impact:

1 000 Haitian received hygienic kits and clothes from our team

600 Haitian repatriates received cash advance to reach their hometown.

Education Program

Quality Education is recognized worldwide as a powerful tool to individual elevation. It gives people the ability to think and make important decisions regarding their country, family and themselves. Poor education yields unequivocally poor citizens that are less productive and unable to shift the course of their country into progress. Instead of contributing to the society's progress, poor performance in literacy and numeracy create individual with less intellectual ability to make their society prosper. That is why this year, our organization went to schools and communities to engage in discussion with students and people around topics related to climate change and social justice.



Impact:

5 000 young people and community leaders participated in these exchanges to raise awareness about important issues that affect all of us.

Climate Justice Program

As humans, the air we breathe, the food we eat and the water we drink which are essential for our survival depend on the health of our blue planet earth. Climate change becomes the greatest Armageddon threatening the existence of the biocenosis. The main problem is not the climate change itself because this happened long time ago, it is the pace human activities accelerated that change which causes the gloom and doom concerns. In this Anthropocene era, our organization reminds itself constantly of the place of Haiti in this uncertain time. Several reports delineate the impact of climate change upon farmers, rural communities and the country. Natural disasters become recurrent, and the country loses, each year, millions of dollars and thousands of lives be it from earthquakes, floods, cyclone...

Fair World Builders team deciphers a program related to climate justice so that it raises awareness about the issue and engage young people in this battle so that they can make their voice heard and discuss the mitigation strategy and innovation related to adaptation so that the country faces the challenges that the global warming presents.

Impacts:

5 000 people living in shorelines has been sensitized

3 groups of students from different universities engage in a race for the sea

3 articles highlighting the issue published



Climate Program: Readiness

Empowering young leaders to be able to achieve change in their society is one of our most important goals during a fiscal year. After starting the readiness project with the support of the International Organization of the Francophonie, our team, in collaboration with the environment ministry, executed the final workshop with young people and local leaders in Port-au-Prince, the Capital of Haiti, to brainstorm about the best way this country could get supported from Green Climate Fund to achieve the climate justice necessary to mitigate the impact of climate change on vulnerable people.

Impact:

50 youth organization leaders and local authorities participated in exchange for supporting our community.



FWB Community

A vision and a mission cannot be achieved without the commitment of a group of people who stick to them. No matter how fascinating a vision might be, an institution must rely on its team to achieve it. Throughout the year, our team and volunteers from across Haiti put effort toward our common goals of upholding education, raising awareness about the climate change, empowering women and girls and providing justice to those, most often, forgotten by the justice authorities.

Young people from universities, schools and professionals gather to make our vision and mission moving forward by embracing the cause and sometimes put their life at risk in seeking ways to impact lives and reclaim those in dire situations: rural women and girls, farmers, youth in jail and so forth.

As Haiti is crossing a very catastrophic period of its history, young people remain the most powerful weapon that keeps this organization energetic, optimistic and unshakable toward its prospective. From our administration to our volunteers, together we have created a better Haiti by changing attitude and bringing hope to hopeless.
