Dear Friends and supporters,



Young inmates program

This young inmate program empowers youth in prisons to be resilient and respectful citizens in their communities. Young inmates in this program receive education skills, legal and psychological supports, create networks and develop confidence necessary for their growth. It is what allows them to see life through a different lens and perspective so they can make their way out of chaos.

Before coming up with our solutions, we conducted interviews and took their different perspective in order to delineate what brought them to where they are so that we can analyze what to do to better support them. This approach allows us to think out of the box and be adjustable in our strategy whenever possible.



Training
